HISTORIC ANNIVERSARY YEAR FOR THE LMHC KICKS OFF!

History is happening every day!

As sesquicentennial celebrations begin to ramp up to commemorate the 250th anniversary of our nation's founding, the La Mesa History Center is also excited to be ramping up our own celebrations for the group's 50th anniversary. Events will officially kick off at our annual meeting and picnic on Sunday, June 29th. This event will run from 4:00 pm to 6:00 pm and we are excited to announce that it will have a theme of the 1970's to bring back memories of our founding. In addition to a short program and voting session for next year's Board membership, a new exhibit, 50 Years of Documenting La Mesa, will open in the McKinney House exhibit room. The exhibit will highlight the McKinney family, the history of the McKinney House and the amazing volunteers who came together in 1975 to form the La Mesa Historical Society.

Attendees are encouraged to bring out their best vintage 1970s outfits to show off their style. Since we will be meeting a little later in the evening we will have a food truck serving a selection of burgers, fries and beverages. SITE RENOVATIONS UPDATE

The Display Building and Trellis are Complete

If you have driven by the History Center site lately you have noticed the new display building and shade trellis are complete. These two projects are two of the largest components of the landscape renovation project and we are thrilled to finally have them done. Both provide us with more opportunities for outdoor interaction with the public and allow us to interpret local history to a wider audience. Next we will be working on the first display for the new building and then interpretive signage which will be added throughout the site. The first sign will be located near the lemon crate interactive exhibit on Pine Street and will tell the history of the citrus industry in La Mesa. A \$1000 grant from the La Mesa Rotary will pay for that sign. We are still looking for an additional \$4000 to fund the rest of the exterior signage.


