

SITE RENOVATIONS UPDATE

The Display Building and Trellis are Complete

If you have driven by the History Center site lately you have noticed the new display building and shade trellis are complete. These two projects are two of the largest components of the landscape renovation project and we are thrilled to finally have them done. Both provide us with more opportunities for outdoor interaction with the public and allow us to interpret local history to a wider audience. Next we will be working on the first display for the new building and then interpretive signage which will be added throughout the site. The first sign will be located near the lemon crate interactive exhibit on Pine Street and will tell the history of the citrus industry in La Mesa. A \$1000 grant from the La Mesa Rotary will pay for that sign. We are still looking for an additional \$4000 to fund the rest of the exterior signage.
